The Lonnie Poole Golf Course at NC State University has unique features that set it apart from other courses in the region. It represents the evolution in golf course architecture toward sustainability, such as the use of reclaimed water for irrigation from the City of Raleigh and a golf course that fits into and protects the natural environment. As with Bethpage Black, Bandon Dunes, Whistling Straits, and Pine Valley, it leans heavily on traditional Scottish designs while accommodating the natural landscape.

The Lonnie Poole Golf Course at NC State University is designed and built to be a championship golf course. Multiple tees allow
